Support Dogs (Sheffield) is a small charity providing support to people affected by autism, epilepsy, and physical disability in order that they can enjoy a greater level of independence.

They aim to do this by giving training and support to individuals by the provision of a registered support dog. They do not charge for their services, nor do they receive any government or NHS funding and rely entirely on voluntary donations.

The branch currently has just over 200 volunteers and is currently working with 117 families and supporting the training of 52 dogs. Last year the charity provided over 600,000 hours of care for children and adults affected by autism, epilepsy, and disability.
